Maitland Gaol has a vibrant history spanning more than 150 years. After housing some of Australia's most hardened criminals, the maximum security facility which was the longest continually operating gaol in Australia, closed its doors on 31st January 1998.

Open 7 days, Maitland Gaol offers visitors the opportunity to indulge in a world class self-guided audio tour. Additionally, themed guided tours and torchlight tours by night are regularly available and are a great way to interpret this unique attraction.

During Bitter and Twisted, regular abridged Ex-Inmate Guided Tours will be on offer to explore selected parts of the facility. Also included in these special tours will be access to areas not normally open to the public on regular tours of the Gaol, as well as special exhibits presented particularly for the weekend.

TWISTED BEER FACTS

- Australia's oldest brewery still in operation is Cascade, established in Tasmania in 1824 at the Old Hobart Gaol.
- Beer is the second most popular beverage in the world, coming in behind tea.
- The oldest known written recipe is for beer.
- To get rid of the foam at the top of beer (thehead), stick your fingers in it.
- Tegestology is what collecting beer coasters is called.



Tokens

Tokens

Tokens are the main currency used within the Gaol walls. These are used for tastings of beer and wine, water and soft drinks, food, coffee, official Festival merchandise, there is limited opportunity to use cash/efpos. It is valid currency for:

- General stalls selling arts, crafts and produce etc., Gaol Tours, official Festival merchandise and face painting (Sat only, Sun is free for kids)

Where can I buy Tokens?

Watch out for the selected mobile Brew Crew members who will be wandering throughout the site selling tokens (cash sales only). If you can't see one close by you can also buy tokens from:

- Official Festival Merchandise Stall (cash and efpos)
- Ticket Inclusion Tent (cash and efpos)
- Tokens are sold in bundles of 5 (minimum purchase \$5.00)

How do they Work?

1 Token = \$1 so if you are purchasing an item worth \$5 you will need 5 tokens. For an item worth \$10 you will need 10 tokens etc.

All stalls where tokens are used will have clearly marked token values on display for their product.

Unused Tokens

At the end of the Festival, tokens that you haven't used cannot be redeemed for cash.

If you are unsure of how many you will use, we suggest you purchase tokens in smaller quantities.

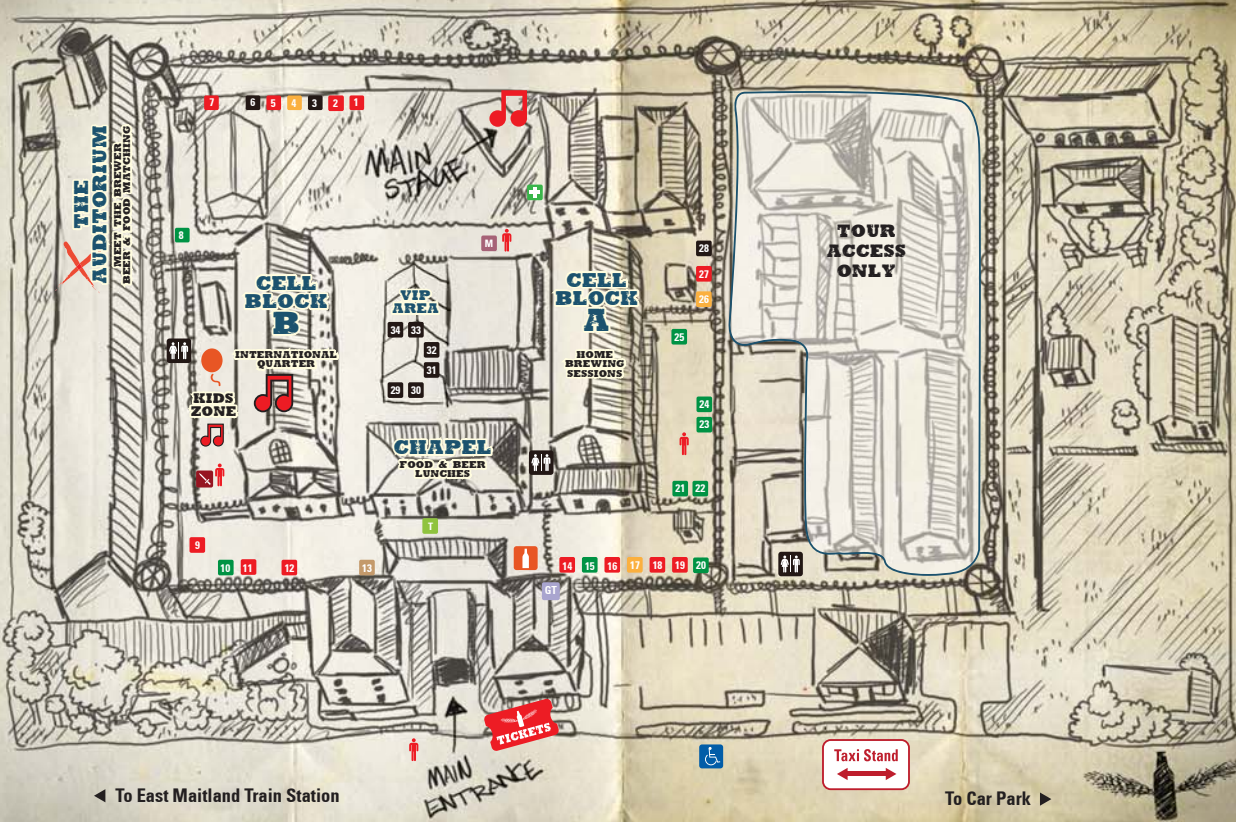
